He mentioned how he spent 6-7 years at Hartnell College trying to figure out what he wanted to do for the rest of his life. Ultimately, he decided to major in Liberal Studies to become a teacher.

It was really interesting to hear how he got hired to a 5th grade class at Arroyo Seco Elementary School only a few weeks after he graduated. He was searching for a job as a substitute teacher however, his teacher helped him look for a job and then found a teaching position for Ivan at this elementary, thought it was perfect position for him. He was hired right away without any teaching experience and without a teaching credential. His life changed so fast in the best way, he was given a great opportunity to begin his career as a teacher, even though he didn't feel prepared to teach a 5th grade class. His story definitely demonstrates the critical teacher shortage in our communities, schools are willing to hire young people with no experience to teach at their schools. Ivan is so lucky to have had this opportunity right after he graduated, I hope I'm as lucky as him to be hired at a local elementary school.

Even though he was thrown into a classroom with no teaching experience, he felt confident with the students and he prepared a bit by watching videos on youtube. His philosophy is to simply 'love your students', it's important to support them, love them and make them feel special. He wants his students to feel comfortable in the classroom while also learning. He mentioned how the principal gave him a list of names of the children who were considered as the 'bad kids', however he chose not to read it and treat every single student with respect and fairness. As the time went by, parents began to change their students to his classroom because they notice that his students truly enjoyed being part of his class. After asking him about his rule in regards to homework assignments, he mentioned that he does not assign homework to students, the only thing he does ask his students to do is to read for 30 minutes every day. He wants them to enjoy their free time at home with their families. He gives them a reading log where they record the book they read every day and allows them to read any book they want according to their reading level. Overall, his first year teaching was full of lessons and adjustments that will somehow help him become an even greater teacher as time goes by. After hearing Ivan's story, I feel very happy for him because after everything he has been through, he's now becoming a great teacher and role model for not only his students but also for other people like me. He definitely deserves to be where he is right now, he has worked so hard to learn English, complete all his assignments in school despite his issues with the language and managed to graduate from CSUMB as a Liberal Studies major after spending several years at Hartnell College not knowing what to do as a career. I assumed that one of the reasons why he doesn't assign any homework assignment besides reading for 30 minutes, is due to all the homework Ivan was assigned when he was in 5th grade. In a way, he does not want his students to struggle as much as he did when he was in 5th grade. It's great to see that he's creating ways for his students to learn without giving them so much homework which in many cases causes students to really hate school. I know that he will continue to find new ways to teach and become a better teacher for his students.

I truly enjoyed how this class wasn't like most of all the classes where the teacher simply lectures throughout the entire class. Each group was in charge of presenting the content of the chapter they were assigned to the class in a different way. To be honest, the class was never boring to me due to the amount of information I learned every day and also the way the class was taught.
